Steeples Placed Atop Queen of Peace Cemetery Chapel!

The management of Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island marked the next phase of construction for Queen of Peace Cemetery in Old Westbury with the lifting and installation of two new metal steeples to crown the cemetery chapel on the morning of Wednesday, December 1, 2021.

The chapel, constructed from Indiana limestone, is the centerpiece of Long Island's newest cemetery's grounds. The two new metal steeples crown the building at a height of 65 feet—approximately five stories—giving an impressive view to visitors as well as motorists passing along nearby Jericho Turnpike. When the chapel opens—expected to be this summer—the chapel will be capable of hosting committal services and periodic memorial Masses for up to approximately 200 members of the Catholic faithful.

"The construction of Queen of Peace is a historic and monumental undertaking and will serve the Catholic faithful of Long Island for well over the next hundred years. We look forward to welcoming visitors and parishioners from across the Diocese when Queen of Peace formally opens in a few months," said Richard Bie, President and CEO of Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island.

Adorning the interior of the chapel will be numerous reclaimed religious fixtures from across the Tri-State area, including a chapel altar set from The Guardian Angel Chapel in Brooklyn, NY and stained-glass windows from the Sisters of Christian Charity's chapel in New Jersey.

"Our mission of serving Catholic families across Long Island is being bolstered today as we move ever closer to the opening of our newest hallowed resting ground for the faithful. Those who visit this inspiring chapel and sacred



grounds will be moved by the thought and care that have gone into every aspect of this project," said Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island Board Chairman Richard Sullivan.

This first phase of construction of Queen of Peace will continue through the Spring of 2022 and includes the construction of the chapel, garden mausoleums, administration facility and maintenance buildings.

PLOTS NOW AVAILABLE AT QUEEN OF PEACE

While construction on the site continues, graves are now available for both at-need and pre-need purchases.

Single grave and **double grave** plots may be purchased in Section 1, which is adjacent to the oval which will feature Chapel, garden mausoleums, and administration building once construction is completed.


Stations of the Cross — Lent 2022

One of the most heavily-attended events at Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island has been the walking of the Stations of the Cross at Cemetery of the Holy Rood. Annually, hundreds of family members have gathered to follow a 1.5 mile route throughout Holy Rood to commemorate Our Lord's redemptive death.

Unfortunately, the pandemic prevented us from holding this in-person gathering the past two years. However, Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island is pleased to announce the return of our Stations of the Cross prayer service at Holy Rood this **Good Friday, April 15th at 12:00 Noon**.



After opening prayers at Holy Rood Chapel, we will begin our pilgrimage through the cemetery, stopping at each of the 14 Stations to pray and reflect. The service will conclude with final prayers and Veneration of the Cross in the Chapel. If the weather is inclement, the full service will be held in the Chapel.



All are invited to our Stations of the Cross service on Good Friday. For those that may be unable to attend, Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island will once again offer **two additional options** for families to prayerfully experience the Stations of the Cross at a time convenient to them:

Self-Directed Stations of the Cross

- Offered at Cemetery of the Holy Rood
- Available throughout Lent and open to all visitors
- Families may pick up a prayer booklet with map from Holy Rood Chapel before following the 1.5 mile route throughout the cemetery. Prayer booklet may also be downloaded from our website

Virtual Stations of the Cross

- Video version of the prayer service allows families to participate in the Stations of the Cross remotely
- Prayer booklet may be downloaded from the website so families may pray the Stations of the Cross together with our deacons




Locate a Loved One Enhancements

Last year, Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island completed a major upgrade to a new cemetery management software. With this software change came an upgrade to our "Locate a Loved One" search tool. In addition to new and improved search functionality, families can view an **interactive cemetery map** which will show them exactly where the plot is located within the cemetery and provide details on who is buried in that particular grave. This mapping functionality is currently available at Cemetery of the Holy Rood, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, and Queen of All Saints Cemetery. Mapping for Queen of Peace Cemetery is currently in progress and will be launched in the near future.

This search tool can be accessed on your **home computer or mobile device** by visiting <u>search.cclongisland.org</u>, or via one of the directory kiosks at our cemetery offices. We hope that these enhancements will better assist families in locating their loved ones at our cemeteries.



Initial search results provide the burial location and date of death of the deceased. In order to access the interactive map, users can click on the **name** of the deceased or on the **map icon** at the right of the screen.



After clicking the name or map icon, the system will zoom in to the plot location on the map and show the names of all those buried in that plot. The user can zoom out in order to view the full map to see where the plot is located within the cemetery. On a mobile device, users can click on the "Walk to Grave" link to pull up Google Maps and get walking directions to their loved one's plot.

Our beautiful and well-maintained cemeteries are conveniently located for families across Long Island. After choosing one of our cemeteries, you will need to determine which burial option is best for your family. Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island offers various alternatives designed to meet the preferences and budgets of families, including those to address the desire for in-ground burial, above-ground entombment, and cremation inurnment options. Options include:

In-Ground Full Casket Burial Options:

- Traditional Graves: Each cemetery offers graves of varying sizes to best meet a family's needs – from single grave lots, which can accommodate up to three caskets plus three urns, to larger family plots.
 Depending on the burial section within the cemetery, loved ones are memorialized by varying height upright monuments or lawn-level bronze markers.
- Lawn Crypts provide burial space for two in a preinstalled, double depth concrete chamber. Lawn crypts
 provide families with the majority of their cemetery
 needs (burial space and outer container) at an
 affordable price. Lawn crypts are available exclusively
 at Holy Sepulchre and Queen of All Saints.
- Private Family Mausoleums offer a family legacy.
 Due to the uniqueness of this option, interested families are urged to call the office at the cemetery they are interested in for details.

Mausoleum Full Casket Entombment Options:

- Interior Community Mausoleums, available currently
 at Holy Rood, Queen of All Saints and Holy
 Sepulchre, offer interior single crypts as well as double
 crypts, including the popular "companion" style crypts.
 Our buildings incorporate artwork reflective of our
 Catholic faith and traditions.
- Garden Community Mausoleums, available currently at Holy Sepulchre and Queen of All Saints (and later this year at Queen of Peace) are crypts in outdoor, garden settings. Our mausoleum buildings are surrounded by beautifully landscaped garden areas and artwork.



Cremation Inurnment Options:

- Niches in either Indoor or Garden Mausoleums are designed for families choosing cremation. A variety of cremation niche space memorialization (marble, granite, mosaic, or glass front) are available within the community mausoleums of each cemetery.
- Cremation Graves are specific dedicated plots for the in-ground burial of cremated remains. Cremation graves can accommodate up to six urns in a single plot. Cremation graves are currently available at Holy Rood and Holy Sepulchre.

MONUMENT CLEANING SERVICES

A clean monument enhances the natural qualities of the granite and adds to the overall beauty of a well-kept cemetery. Our staff is knowledgeable on the cleaning products necessary to remove different types of stains.





Pricing for this service is determined by monument size. Please note that monument cleaning services are only available during the months of May through October. GRAVESITE BOUQUET HOLDERS

Aluminum bouquet holders are the perfect place for floral arrangements and are a lasting and beautiful memorial tribute. Available for use at most in-ground burial sites, these bouquet holders come in two parts: the holder and the insert. The holder can easily be inverted when not in use.



Bouquet holders are **\$65** and can be **purchased online** or at the cemetery office.

SHRUB AND BUSH MAINTENANCE

A well-maintained, balanced shrub or bush enhances the natural qualities of the plant, adds to the overall beauty of the family plot and compliments the monument. With regular maintenance throughout the growing season, early detection of growth-related problems are possible. A treated bush can be saved when early detection occurs.



Pricing starts at \$60 per shrub/bush trimmed or removed. To request service, please contact the cemetery office or complete the <u>Maintenance Request Form</u> on our website.

Your photograph or digital image can be turned into a protected memorial to capture the memory of your loved one for generations to come. Catholic Cemeteries of Long



When subscribing to the **floral vase program**, Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island will supply and install an artificial floral arrangement in a vase for a crypt or niche front. Queen of Peace Cemetery Updates

Queen of Peace Cemetery, the first new Catholic cemetery to open on Long Island in decades, is nearing completion of this phase of its development, with construction crews now focused on minor finishing details for the Garden Mausoleums, Administration building, and Maintenance building. Meanwhile, steady efforts continue on the interior of Queen of Peace Chapel, where repurposed stained glass windows, including those depicting the life of Mary, an altar and pews are being reconfigured and installed.

Once all construction activity is complete, the main entrance, located on Jericho Turnpike between Powells Lane and Hitchcock Lane, will be opened and the temporary entrance on Powells Lane will be permanently closed. As of this writing, Queen of Peace Cemetery remains open seven days a week for in-ground burials, at need and pre-need purchases of grave plots, and visitation of loved ones.

LIMITED PLOTS AVAILABLE AT QUEEN OF PEACE

A limited number of **single grave** and **double grave** plots remain available for purchase in Section 1, which is adjacent to the oval featuring the Chapel, Garden Mausoleums, and Administration building. To ensure excellent customer service, all families interested in purchasing in-ground burial space at Queen of Peace should call **(516) 434-2439** to make an appointment. A scheduled appointment will allow our sales representatives the time necessary to show you the available burial options and answer all of your questions.

COMING SOON: CRYPT & NICHE SALES!

The Garden Mausoleums at Queen of Peace feature crypts and niches which encircle three sides of the Chapel. Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island expects to open up sales of these crypt and niche spaces within the next few weeks. As is the case with in-ground grave purchases, appointments will be strongly encouraged, as demand for these crypts and niches is expected to be high. We will send out a notification to those on our email list once Mausoleum sales are ready to begin. Updates will also be posted on our website, CCLongIsland.org.



Are you considering cremation? Do you have the cremated remains of your loved one in your home? Consider a final resting place that reflects the Catholic beliefs and values from life's personal journey.



The Catholic Church teaches that deceased's cremated remains are due the same respect as the body, including burial or entombment under the rights provided by the Order of Christian Funerals. Scattering or dividing cremated remains or keeping cremated remains at home are not reverent dispositions that the Church requires.

In addition to the Church's teaching, there are many benefits to choosing a permanent burial site:

- Provides family and friends with a special place to visit and remember their loved one.
- Memorialization at the cemetery provides a permanent record of your loved one's life.
- Cemeteries will always be there, open to visitations by all for generations to come.

Catholic Cemeteries of Long Island offers families a variety of burial options to best meet your family's needs:

- Cremation niches, which can accommodate up to two urns, are available in indoor and garden settings, with marble, granite and glass front options to choose from.
- Traditional gravesites can accommodate both caskets and urns in the same plot, providing a good option when not all family members wish to be cremated.
- Cremation graves accommodate up to six urns in a single plot. These graves allow upright monuments and are available at Holy Rood and Holy Sepulchre.
